## PLANNING DETAILS

#### YOUR CHECKLIST

FLOOR PLAN: FIRST, MAKE A BASIC SKETCH OF THE FLOOR PLAN AS SEEN FROM A "BIRD'S EYE" VIEW. DRAW JUST THE WALLS, WINDOWS AND DOORS YOU WON'T NEED TO DRAW IN EXISTING CABINETS. THEN, MEASURE EACH OVERALL WALL LENGTH. NEXT, MEASURE AND MARK EACH OPENING: BE SURE TO INCLUDE THE TRIM WORK AS PART OF THE SIZE OF THE DOORS AND WINDOWS. WINDOWS SHOULD ALSO INCLUDE THE OVERALL HEIGHT OF THE WINDOW ITSELF AND THE DISTANCE FROM FLOOR TO SILL.
TIP HAVE YOUR CONTRACTOR MEASURE THE KITCHEN WITH YOU.
PERMANENT ITEMS: Some things cannot be moved, or you may not want them moved. Measure and mark the size and placement of sink drains, natural gas supply, heating vents, range hood ducts, radiators, etc.
Appliance Specifications: Appliances drive the design - meaning cabinetry will be designed around appliance sizes. With so many options available, there are no "standard sizes" for refrigerators, cook tops and built-ins like ovens and microwaves. Your designer will need complete installation specs which can easily be printed from manufacturer's websites. Look for tabs like "Specifications" or "Installation Requirements."
TIP BEFORE YOUR DESIGN APPOINTMENT, TREAT YOURSELF TO WINDOW SHOPPING FOR NEW APPLIANCES, AND MAKE SOME PRELIMINARY SELECTIONS.
IDEA FILE: THINK ABOUT WHAT YOU LOVE (OR HATE) ABOUT YOUR KITCHEN NOW, AND WHAT YOU MOST WANT FROM YOUR NEW KITCHEN. BRING PHOTOS FROM MAGAZINES, BROCHURES, WEBSITES, ETC. ALSO BRING SAMPLES FROM ANY ELEMENTS YOU'VE ALREADY SELECTED - FROM FLOORING TO THAT SPECIAL ACCESSORY COLOR YOU WANT TO FEATURE.



### HOW TO MEASURE FOR YOU NEW KITCHEN

**MEASURING FOR YOUR NEW KITCHEN DOESN'T HAVE TO BE DIFFICULT.** ALL YOU NEED IS A TAPE MEASURE, PENCIL, AND THE PROVIDED FLOOR PLAN GRID.

Use the same grid below as a guide and create a sketch of the room.


- 1. START IN ONE CORNER OF THE ROOM, SELECT A WALL AND MEASURE THE DISTANCE. IN INCHES, OF EVERY ITEM ON THAT WALL FROM THE CORNER. WRITE ALL MEASUREMENTS ON YOUR SKETCH.
- 2. GO TO THE NEXT CORNER AND LOCATE EVERY ITEM ON THE NEXT WALL IN RELATIONSHIP TO THAT CORNER.
- 3. CONTINUE TO MEASURE ALL AROUND THE ROOM, UNTIL EVERYTHING IS LOCATED, MEASURED, AND MARKED ON YOUR SKETCH.
- 4. JOT DOWN THE OVERALL LENGTH OF WALLS, **HEIGHT OF THE ROOM** AND DISTANCE OF EVERY ITEM FROM THE FLOOR-LIKE OUTLETS, LIGHT SWITCHES, AND LEDGES OR SOFFITS.
